## BEST DESIGN-FOCUSED MUSEUM SHOP

When Hauser & Wirth (hauserwirthlosangeles.com) opened in 2016, it quickly became the heartbeat of DTLA's Arts District. The transformed flour mill has drawn in locals and tourists alike with its cutting-edge exhibitions; delightful public garden; and Manuela, the chic, Southerninspired eatery known as much for its flaky biscuits and inventive cocktails as it is its gorgeous open-air design. Now, adding to the allure is the Hauser & Wirth Gallery Shop, which offers a curated selection of handcrafted items from local and international makers. Think lambswool and cashmere blankets (\$700 to \$1,000); handcarved wood serving utensils (\$200 to \$400); and pottery (\$80 to \$200) made in collaboration with the gallery's artists, including Mary Heilmann, Lee Lorenzo, Eva Hesse and more. "[We also carry] skate decks by L.A.-based artist Paul McCarthy (\$350), the proceeds of which fund community spaces in developing nations, [and] knives (\$350 per set) made with wood from the farm surrounding the site of Hauser & Wirth Somerset," says Senior Director Stacen Berg.
