The newest offering is the Super boosted Re-conditioning and Firming Treatment for the body, which is a decadent two hours' worth of very fine exfoliating and reflexology-style kneading, pummeling, and massaging, which, as you'd hope, leave the skin smooth, nourished, and fresh.
